

Anti-Trust Compliance Policy

New Hampshire Vaccine Association (the “NHVA”) was established by act of the New Hampshire Legislature for the purpose of collecting and remitting adequate funds from health carriers and third party administrators for the cost of vaccines provided to certain children of the State of New Hampshire. NHVA will comply fully with all laws that relate to the conduct of its activities, including all antitrust laws, federal or state.

NHVA Board is comprised, among others, of insurers and third party administrators that are participants in the New Hampshire health care coverage marketplace. Participants in NHVA activities must limit discussions and any sharing of information to that necessary to the legitimate purposes of the NHVA and refrain from any discussion that may suggest that the members of the NHVA are agreeing to take any action that would affect prices, services, allocation of markets or other matters having an effect in the marketplace outside of NHVA’s bona fide endeavors.

The NHVA acts with the guidance of legal counsel. Any Board member who has concerns regarding the propriety of any board activity or discussion, either in a formal meeting or otherwise, is advised to notify legal counsel for the Board, their own legal counsel, or both. Any other participant in NHVA activities who has concerns regarding the propriety of any board activities or discussions may notify Board counsel and may consult with their own legal counsel at their own discretion.
